AN INTRODUCTION TO MELTON WOLD

① Location:

Melton Wold guest farm lies on the high plateau of the Great Karoo, some 630 km from Cape Town and 800 km from Johannesburg. It is located between the towns of Victoria West to the east and Carnarvon to the north-west. The N12, linking Kimberley to the N1, is the main junction access to the farm.

② Geography:

Much of the farm lies at an altitude of about 1300 metres above-sea-level. The property is located within a broad, shallow valley, flanked by low hill ranges, and within the catchment of the Brak River.

③ Climatic influences:

This is a semi-desert area, receiving a meagre average rainfall of 230 mm. Most of this precipitation falls during the summer months. As is common to arid areas rainfall is unpredictable and droughts frequent. The relatively high altitude has a moderating influence on summer temperatures but winter nights can be very cold, and frost not infrequent.

④ Vegetation:

Except around the homestead, with its preponderance of tall exotic trees, much of the farm is covered by short karroid scrub and succulent shrubs. These plants are adapted to withstand long dry seasons and drought. Plants that may appear dead at first glance, following rain come into leaf and blossom.

⑤ Animal life:

The recording of the region's animal life extends back at least 250 million years when much of the Karoo was a great swamp. An example of one of the creatures of that time, a *Bradysaurus*, can be seen on the farm. In more recent times, up to the middle years of the 19th century, the area played seasonal host to great herds of nomadic game. These included springbok, red hartebeest, eland and the now extinct quagga. Hook-lipped rhinoceroses were to be found wherever there were thickets and bushed river courses. It is even said that during years of good rains small groups of elephant entered the region from the coastal mountains. Lion were common, and the now endangered wild dog roamed in packs across the Karoo. Sadly, today these great herds are no more but the owners have reintroduced some game species and plan to bring in more. For such a dry area the animal life is amazingly rich and diverse, with 45 mammals species, over 200 birds, 29 reptiles and 5 amphibians.

HOW TO USE THESE CHECKLISTS AND KEYS:

Habitat:

Where possible we have given an indication of the range of the animals on Melton Wold. We are well aware that some species may be seen in all habitats, others are highly restricted. Some are most likely to be found in a particular habitat but on occasion may be found in others.
